Message from the Chief of Police



Colonel Jeremy Ihler Chief of Police

As we transition to warmer weather, you will notice more people outdoors, more drivers on our roadways, and more general activity in our City. Each member of our community plays a significant role in the safety and protection of ourselves and others. Please make an effort to connect and maintain relationships with your neighbors, be aware of your surroundings, and take steps to reduce opportunities for crime to occur. Your police department is here to support and assist you with your concerns.

Even though we should be proud of our overall average decrease of -14% in crime when comparing 2018 and 2019 (Figure 1.), we must remain vigilant in our effort to improve the quality of life in our community. We celebrate short-term success, but we must keep in mind that the real goal is continuous improvement in the long-term. Success is a process that continues, and it requires the public and the police to work closely together.

Crime: Data, Reporting, and Reducing

As it concerns crime within the City, we have experienced an overall average decrease of -14% in crime when collectively considering homicide, rape, robbery, assault, burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft annually when comparing 2018 and 2019. (Figure 1.) As for crimes against persons, we have experienced an annual incremental increase in homicide and rape and decrease in robbery and assault. As for crimes against property, we have experienced significant decreases in burglary and larceny while motor vehicle theft remains constant between the two periods. The overwhelming majority of motor vehicle thefts are a result of people leaving their vehicles running, unlocked, and unattended.

Policing starts with you - the community. You are the heart of the policing mission and we require your involvement to increase the safety and security of our community. If you observe suspicious activity, a crime about to occur, or a crime in progress please call the police immediately so that the police department can investigate these matters quickly to prevent and stop crime. For non-emergency situations, call police dispatch at (314) 889-2341 or (636) 529-8210. For emergency situations, dial 911. Any resident who would like to host a Neighborhood Watch meeting in their area to discuss crime and other policing related matters and initiatives, please contact the police department office during normal business hours, between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm, to make arrangements. The police department will

have a police officer available to attend your meeting and we will help you with marketing your neighborhood meeting.

Seasonal crime patterns are periodic fluctuations in the victimization rates that tend to occur at the same time each year. Crime rates and weather are, surprisingly, linked in a number of ways. While it might sound odd, the temperature outside has a rather profound effect on the occurrence of crimes in our area. More daylight hours and warmer temperatures means that more people are out for longer periods than in the colder seasons. This means that there are more chances for crimes of opportunity to arise. Road Maintenance and Motorist Safety



As you drive the City, you will occasionally come across issues on our roadways that require attention. If you need to report repair issues, such as pot holes, signals on flash or dark, and downed stop signs, there are three roadway maintenance agencies that handle these type of issues: Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT), St. Louis County Department of Transportation (DOT), and the City of Bellefontaine Neighbors (BN) Street Department. (Figure 3.) Each agency handles a different

set of roadways. (Figure 2.) However, if you need to report traffic crashes, stranded motorists, and other issues regarding crime and safety on our roadways, please contact the police department.

With respect to utility and roadway repairs, along with your fellow motorists, it is your responsibility to be aware of your surroundings while driving and obey the traffic laws. Speed is a commonly reported problem. Although speed limits are set by law by street (Figure 2.), it is your responsibility as a driver to drive safely. This means that there will be circumstances where the safe driving option is traveling at a speed lower than the speed limit. Responsible driving reduces driving-related property damage, personal injury to members of our community, and the cost of vehicle insurance. -Chief Ihler
