River Woods Business Development

In 1999, the City of BN had a vision of a business park at the corner of Highway 367 and 270. After working with (then) Representative Tim Green, an agreement was made with the State of Missouri and the City of St. Louis.

The City of BN was able to obtain an option on the land and worked with developers and realtors to develop a business park, but was not able to generate interest in the property. Finally, in 2004, the land was sold to Tom Glosier, Manager of Kaplan Development, who

planned a business park and residential subdivisions on the property. The first subdivision, The Landings at Lewis and Clark, was started in 2006 and due to the economy was stopped. The builder, T. R. Hughes filed bankruptcy and the new owner of the undeveloped lots is the Frontenac Bank.

On April 15, 2010, Tom Glosier addressed the Board of Aldermen with good news. Block Hawley, Commercial Real Estate Services, is the owner under contract for 128 acres and will be acting as the developer. Jeffery Hawley, President of Block Hawley,

has already spent more than \$60,000 in site engineering and is planning to saturate the market with information on the property. They hope to attract a corporate campus, medical office tenants or mixed businesses to the potential million square feet of buildings.



Jeff Hawley is excited about the project and is very eager to tell people about the location, easy highway access to everywhere in the region, the available workforce in the area and the amenities they are planning to provide.

Costs listed are estimated. In some cases, the cost of repairs is more than estimated because of deteriorating conditions not seen before work began.

The estimated start date for Street Repairs 2010 (Phase II) is expected to begin in May of 2010. The work will last about 180 days so the completion date will be in October of 2010, weather permitting. Most of the work will be done by ward, and should not continue for more than 6 weeks in any one location.

Street repairs for 2009, Phase I were started in fall of 2009. Streets in Ward 1 were completed and work was started in Ward 4, but had to be halted due to the weather. Work began again as soon as the weather was favorable in late March, 2010.

The City of BN and Weis Design Group is working to keep any inconvenience by contractors to a minimum for residents. Unfortunately, there are times that it cannot be avoided. Residents who have problems or complaints should contact City Hall at 867-0076 and we will address any complaints you may have. When the work is done, we are sure you will say it was well worth any inconvenience.

Street Repairs in Ward 2 are underway and will be completed within the next month or two. Work in Ward 3 is just beginning. We are currently working with the utility companies to insure they are not coming in to tear up work we have just completed. We expect work to start on Phase II before Phase I is complete.

Shepley Road Bridge Closed May 28 to August 7, 2010

In about 1892, the railroad was constructed through the area. The land on both sides of the track from Bellefontaine Road on the west to Carr Lane (now Toelle Lane) on the east was owned by the Coburg Land and Development Company (CLDC). The CLDC platted Shepley Drive across its land and received permission from the railroad to construct a wood bridge in 1922 and assumed the cost of building and maintaining the bridge.

In 1932 the St. Louis County Court ordered the County to accept and maintain Shepley Drive and the wooden bridge. Eighteen years later, in 1950, Bellefontaine Neighbors was incorporated and the bridge was in the incorporated area.

In April of 1957, the CB & Q Railroad notified the City that the bridge was in a hazardous condition and unsafe for traffic. The bridge was barricaded.

A dispute between the City and Railroad over who should pay to build a new bridge went on for the next four years. The dispute was taken all the way to the Missouri Supreme Court. Finally, in August of 1961, the City and the Railroad entered into an agreement, which provided the City would pay 42.5% of the cost of the new bridge and upon completion the City would maintain and own the bridge. The new bridge was a 3-span prestressed concrete structure, 17 feet 6 inches wide and 120 feet in length and was designed and constructed by the CB & Q Railroad's Bridge Department in 1962.

The Shepley Road Bridge served the City well until 2002, when the bridge was found to be in need of repairs. Modjeski & Masters, Consulting Engineers were hired for engineering and site inspection during construction. The Harlan Company was hired for bridge repairs and the work was completed in September of 2002 at a cost to the city of \$91,232.55.

In 2007, the City of BN hired The Weis Engineering

Group to assess the streets that were in need of repair. With the recommendation from Weis, the bridge over the now Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad was tested and found to be in need of major repairs including deck and joint replacement, improvements for pedestrian, bicycle and handicap accessibility and stabilization of the approaches to the bridge.



With the engineering costs estimated at \$580,300, the City directed Weis Design Group to apply for a grant to repair the bridge. The grant was approved.

Funding is from the Federal Highway Administration's Surface Transportation Program-Streets/Bridge Replacement and Rehabilitation Program. The East/

West Gateway Coordination Council oversees administration of the grant program.

The grant will cover 80% of the costs or \$464,240. The City of BN will cover 20% or \$116,060.

The Shepley Road Bridge will close as soon as school is over, on or about May 29, 2010. The construction is expected to be completed in six weeks, but the contract allows until August 7, 2010 to allow for weather.

The City of BN is responsible for two other bridges. The Bridge on Belgrove over the Watkins Creek was replaced in 1999 by R. C. Schneider and Associates for a cost of \$112,620 with the city paying \$52,620 and the State paying \$50,000. This bridge is being evaluated for the need of maintenance and repairs.

The St. Cyr Bridge, a much older structure, is a small bridge over Calumet Creek where it empties into the Maline Creek on the industrial side of St. Cyr Road. This structure was built around the 1930's. This bridge is in need of repair and the City of BN will be working with MSD and applying for a grant in that will be available in 2011.

Mosquito Control



The City of BN contracts with St. Louis County for mosquito control. You may see the trucks out in the evening fogging. All of this is a waste of money if residents don't eliminate all standing water. Just a cup of standing water can produce hundreds of mosquitoes. By eliminating the water, we can eliminate mosquito breeding. Empty water from flower pots, remove trash and keep your grass and bushes cut to eliminate breeding and resting places. If you have excessive mosquitoes, call the City Hall at 867-0076.

Disposing Of Old Televisions And Electronics



Old television sets, computers and electronic devices can no longer be put out with regular trash. Missouri Statutes were changed in 2008 to meet federal guidelines. Waste Management (WM), and all of the other waste haulers are no longer able to put these items in landfills.

Midwest Recycling Center will hold an electronic waste collection event on Saturday, September 25, 2010 at the Florissant Valley Community College, 3400 Pershall Road from 9 AM to 2 PM. There will be a \$10 fee for computer monitors and a \$15 fee for any size television. All other electronic items will be accepted FREE of charge. For more information, please visit their web site at www.midwrc.net

Other items banned include, computers, hard drives, (CRT, LED and Plasma) monitors and televisions, printers, routers, scanners, zip or floppy drives, adding machines, copiers, phones, cordless phones, fax machines, battery back-ups, digital cameras, DVD/ video players, electronic game devices, pocket PC's and rechargeable batteries.

WM will take television sets, but residents have to call (506-4700) for a special pick-up. The cost is \$20. WM will not pick up any other electronic devices.

Before you buy replacement electronics, check and see if the store has a program to dispose of the old electronics. There are several organizations that will accept electronic devices. E-cycle St. Louis, The St. Louis Regional Partnership, has five members approved by the St. Louis-Jefferson County Solid Waste Management. They are:

Other Ways To Recycle

Cell phones, chargers, cords and equipment are being collected by the Knights of Columbus in support of the "Cell Phones for Soldiers Program."



Phones are refurbished for use or dismantled and all parts are recycled. Proceeds go to buy soldiers who are overseas pre-paid phone cards. Old phones and equipment can be dropped off at the City of BN City Hall, 9641 Bellefontaine Road or the Knights of Columbus, 800 Chambers Road.



Compact Fluorescent Light (CFL) Bulbs have become popular because of energy savings and long life. They are safe to use but they contain a small amount of mercury vapor and should be disposed of properly. AmerenUE is working with local retailers to make CFL recycling free and

easy. Recycling locations are the Home Depot stores at 13916 and 10930 Halls Ferry.

Plastic grocery bags can be returned to many of the local grocery stores, or ask for paper bags that can be recycled or use reusable cloth bags sold in grocery stores, then there is nothing to recycle. The reusable bags are easy to carry and hold more.



Used Playground Equipment Sent To Honduras

When the City of BN was told by the insurance company that playground equipment in Bissell and St. Cyr Parks was not up to standards, Mark Dickerson, Director of Parks and Recreation, got a grant for new equipment that has a concrete base with a 4 inch thick rubberized pad.

Some of the old playground equip-

ment wasn't worth saving, but some was. Mark contacted the Wamhoff Foundation and they took the old equipment, shipped it to Honduras, South America, where they re-assembled it. As soon as the work was done, more than a hundred children who had never seen a playground arrived to try it out. Thanks to Mark for turning trash to treasure.

set up a grant for signs that remind us of this ordinance. The City of BN will be getting 10 free signs.

The ordinances, passed in The City of BN, St. Louis County and most all municipalities are meant to save children from serious head injuries.

Call City Hall to let us know where and when your party is so we can put you on the list for elected officials, police officers and the fire department to visit.



We can also arrange to have your street blocked off.

Ask your neighbors to watch your house and let the police know if any suspicious person or vehicle is in the area. Tell them you will do the same for them, not just on Neighborhood Night Out, but 365 days a year. If it doesn't look right to you, it probably isn't.

To report a suspicious person or activity, call 889-2341 or, if you think it is an emergency, 911. Your aldermen are always glad to get your calls, but call the police department first. You can ask to remain anonymous or ask to be contacted by phone only if needed.

Attention Pet Owners

All animals, dogs and cats, are required to obtain yearly rabies vaccinations and a city license due by July 1 of each year. See page 6 for information on the Rabies Clinic being held on June 5. Animals must be kept on leashes when out of the yard at all times. No animals, including cats are allowed to run loose.

Pit Bull dogs and other animals deemed dangerous by the BN Chief of Police may only be kept under strict conditions. Owners of dangerous animals must register them with the City Clerk, provide photographs, keep the animal on a 4 foot leash with a muzzle when outside of a secured indoors or kennel structure and provide proof of \$100,000 liability insurance, per ordinance #1497.
