I want to thank everyone that has helped me during my first year in office. We had a very busy year, beginning with the Good Friday tornado and ending with the Mathews-Dickey Boys' and Girls' Club Park opening in April. We are currently waiting for FEMA

and SEMA to reimburse the city for the storm damage to the parks. We have received partial payment from FEMA, but no funds from SEMA to date.

The City of BN is proud to have been chosen to represent Missouri and compete with 49 other cities, one in each state, in a recycling challenge. Waste Management has partnered with RecycleBank.com and the contest will run between July 1, 2012 and December 31, 2012. The winning community will be awarded a \$100,000 grant for "green projects." Residents can earn points and collect coupons for their participation. A "Introduction Packet" will be delivered to your home in the next few weeks.

Tree & Branch Removal Service Changes

Starting July 1, 2012, the City of BN is implementing new guidelines on tree and branch removal services. These changes are being made due to budget concerns and fewer street department personnel.

The City of BN will continue to remove dead branches or trees that are more than 50% dead, and located within the city easement of 12 feet from the curb.

Private streets such as Green Acres or Coburg Lands (East), etc. do not have a city easement so there will be no services for private streets. County Arterial Roads such as Bellefontaine, Chambers, St. Cyr, Jennings Station and Lilac have a St. Louis County easement and residents should call St. Louis County for more information on branch or tree removal.

The City of BN will not pick up any branches, trees, bushes or other yard waste that was not previously growing on the city's easement. Please consider the following options for removing yard waste:

- The City of BN is urging residents to use the 90 gallon yard waste carts provided free by Waste Management (WM) that will be picked up weekly on the same day as trash and recycling. If you don't have a cart or would like to rent an additional cart for \$2.50 per month, call WM at 506-4700.
- Notify contractors that they will have to remove branches, etc., when cutting trees or bushes.
- When you cut your own trees, look for a contractor to remove the branches or call WM for that service.
- If you are able to transport yard waste yourself, look up yard waste recycling centers.

REMINDER: Do not place yard waste, leaves, branches, etc., in creeks or sewers. Yard waste in sewers or creeks can backup the flow of water and the result could be your basement backing up. **If you see someone dumping yard waste in sewers, streets, or creeks, call 889-2341.**

Fireworks Are Prohibited In The City Of BN

Fireworks are prohibited in the City of BN, unless a permit is issued by the Board of Aldermen. Police answering complaints can confiscate fireworks and issue a summons for you to appear in court. Please stay safe and plan to attend a professional fireworks display.

Code of Ordinances
ARTICLE I. FIREWORKS Sec. 10-1.



(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, offer for sale, expose for sale or to use, discharge or explode within the city any fire-crackers, Roman candles, blank cartridges, toy pistols, toy cannons or canes in which explosives are used, balloons firing from underneath to propel the same, torpedoes, sky rockets, aerial salutes, bombs or other fireworks of any kind.

Free Electronic Recycling Event, June 16, 2012

The City of BN will be partnering with WITS Inc., to sponsor a Free Electronic Recycling Event on Saturday, June 16, 2012, on the City Hall parking lot, 9641 Bellefontaine Road from 9 AM to 3 PM.



WITS is dedicated to reuse and recycling. Nothing donated goes to landfills. WITS fixes and refurbishes electronics computers and surplus equipment from businesses and residents then puts it back into the community for educational use. This keeps the used equipment out of landfills and provides those in need with technology. Items that cannot be fixed are dismantled and taken to appropriate recycling facilities.

WITS protects information on computers with data destruction software which will perform a complete data destruction per NIST and DoD (Department of Defense) 5220.22-M standards. After the data wipe there is no data remaining on the drives. You can also request that your hard drives be destroyed.

WITS is a 501(c)3, tax exempt organization. All donations are tax deductible and tax letters are available upon request at drop-off. Donations are welcome.

WITS accepts almost everything that runs on electric or batteries and some small machinery that runs on gas. If an item you would like to donate is not on the list, call to find out if they will accept it.

City of BN ordinances require that dogs and cats have current rabies tags. The city provides an opportunity to get vaccinations and tags at reduced costs at the Annual Dog & Cat Vaccination Clinic.

The attending Veterinarian is Dr. Dan Wendt, DVM, who owns and operates the Ferguson Animal Clinic at 843 Airport Road.

You can get an additional discount by showing a spay



or neuter certificate or written proof.

City ordinances also require that dogs and cats have a City of BN license. The cost of the license is \$2 and can be purchased at the clinic when you get the shots or at City Hall during regular hours by showing proof of rabies vaccination.

When pets are vaccinated, they get rabies tags. If pets are found by Animal Control officers, tag numbers or microchip numbers are immediately checked in their computers to reunite lost pets with their owners. Pets can't tell authorities where they live - and tags serve as your pet's Free Phone Call Home!

St. Louis County Spay/Neuter Program

In 2005, The St. Louis County Council passed legislation to raise the price for a rabies tag from \$2 to \$3. The extra \$1 is put into a separate fund to help St. Louis County Residents pay to neuter or spay their pets. In 2011, approximately 2,000 vouchers were given out and funding for the year was exhausted by summer, so please apply as soon as possible.

Spaying or neutering pets reduces the number of pets euthanized because of overpopulation, reduces the risk of cancers and pyometra in females and eliminates the problems of female pets going through their cycles. Animals that are neutered or spayed will be less likely to roam, run away or become aggressive.

This is a voucher program that can only be used by St. Louis County residents who have proof that their dogs and cats have been vaccinated for rabies.

Vouchers do not pay the entire cost of neutering or

spaying. Residents are responsible to pay the difference. Approximately 90% of area Veterinarians honor the vouchers. Vouchers are available for:

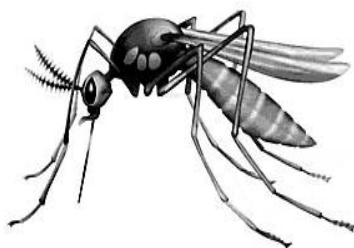

Mosquito Control

Because of the exceptionally mild winter, mosquitoes and other insects are expected to be out in large numbers this summer. The City of BN contracts with St. Louis County for mosquito control and residents will see trucks out in the evening hours this summer. Residents can help by eliminating any standing water so mosquitoes do not have a place to breed. Just a cup of standing water can produce hundreds and thousands of mosquitoes. Empty water from flower pots, remove trash and keep your grass and bushes cut to eliminate breeding and resting places. If you have excessive mosquito problems, call the City Hall at 867-0076 so the city can call St. Louis County Vector Control for additional spraying.



Mathews-Dickey Hosts Soft Opening

Congressman William Lacy Clay, Jr. joined Mathews-Dickey at 10 AM, Saturday, April 21, 2012 for a soft opening of its new Bob Russell Park satellite location at 1080 St. Cyr Rd. Youth Club members unveiled the first four "Field of Dreams" naming rights partner plaques: Centric Group, Johnny Londoff Chevrolet, McDonald's and Paul Cerame Ford-Kia.

Bellefontaine Neighbors Mayor Robert J. Doerr provided remarks and a letter was read from County Executive Charlie Dooley welcoming the Club to North County. Mathews-Dickey President, CEO & Co-Founder Martin Luther Mathews and City of Florissant Economic Director Bob Russell, Jr. threw out the first pitches, prior to youth exhibition baseball games on Fields 5 and 9. After the ceremony, AmeriCorps and Commerce Bank volunteers conducted a beautification day at the park.

"Ever since the news spread that the Club was coming to Bellefontaine Neighbors, children and parents have been knocking down our doors eager to sign up," Mathews said. "We're very grateful to the City of Bellefontaine and all of our community partners for helping us revitalize this field to give youth the vision, courage and determination to achieve success."

The park grounds opened to the tune of Lee Greenwood's "God Bless the USA" sung by Jamie "King James" Dennis. Veteran Broadcaster Bill Wilkerson emceed the festivities, and Executive Assistant to the President, CEO and Co-founder, Jay Washington, Sr. highlighted plans to regenerate youth interest in baseball, boost Earn & Learn opportunities and training in grounds keeping and gardening.

The 30 acres were officially given to the Club by Russell and the Surrey Lane Athletic Association on Oct. 18, 2011. Since then, the Club has leveraged community partnerships to generate excitement and

momentum. One hundred-fifty Harris-Stowe students conducted a Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Beautification Day at the park to clear brush, trash and trim tall grass. Ameren conducted a major tree-trimming effort and worked with its partners to replace dugout structures, repair backstops, and infield renovations. Financial and donations are still being sought to rebuild the concession stand, restore the fields and operate the Sports, Earn & Learn programs.

Mathews-Dickey looks forward to maintaining, operating and upgrading the park to include a number of smaller baseball diamonds, and build a major league-style baseball field and football field. These programs will draw youth from Bellefontaine Neighbors, the City of St. Louis, Dellwood, Florissant, Hazelwood, Jennings, Moline Acres, Pine Lawn, Riverview, Unincorporated St. Louis County, University City and Wellston.

Attention: Special Needs Residents

The City of BN Police Department and the Riverview Fire Protection District keep a running list of residents who have special needs such as oxygen or medical equipment which needs electricity to operate. In the case of an emergency or power outage, these residents are called on to verify they are OK and given any help required.

Both the police and fire department urge you to call in and register for this life-saving service. The list is confidential and will not be shared with anyone.

The RFPD also offers, "The File of Life." This is a small packet with a magnet that has room for all of your medical information and emergency contacts that should be kept on your refrigerator. In the event you need emergency medical attention and cannot speak for yourself, the emergency responders have all of your information. The File for Life is free. For more information, call:

Over the last year, you have watched as the new fire house was built at 9207 Bellefontaine

Road. It is completed and our Firefighters moved into their new home on March 20, 2012. The building turned out very nice and the Fire District is planning to hold an open house, so all Fire District residents can stop by to take the tour. I believe, once you see the building, you will be as pleased as we are. On behalf of our Board of Directors, the Firefighters and me, we are all very grateful for your continued support. This is a building that will last for 50 plus years. Our new lighted message sign will provide you with the date and time of the open house so watch the sign.

On a different topic, I am asking the residents of our City for their help. When looking through the call statistics for this year, I am seeing a trend that needs to stop. Although our Firefighters take great pride in providing the best fire protection in the St. Louis County area, I am seeing that our responses for working house



fires are on the rise.

If I focus just on the City of Bellefontaine Neighbors and look at the reports for house fires and cooking fires; I can tell you that for the first 104 days of the year, we have responded

to and confirmed a working fire every 9 days. This is much higher than normal for our City, and I need your help to stop the rising number of house fires. We are finding careless smoking fires, unattended cooking fires, and on a few occasions candles left burning unattended. These fires can all be avoided if we only take a few moments and think about what we are doing.

Simply put, if you are going to cook, stay in the kitchen; if you are going to smoke, don't leave the burning cigarette unattended; and, please blow out the candle when you leave. Please help us, as we move through the remaining months of the year,

and be aware of what you should be doing to keep your home fire safe.

St. Louis Regional Sustainable Communities

The first meeting for this area was held on March 20, 2012, at Trinity Catholic School with more than 120 residents attending. At the first meeting, the group was asked to identify the

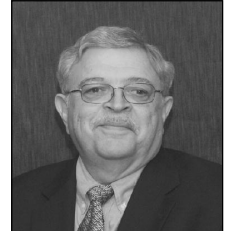
