

### City Of BN Chosen For Recycle Bank Challenge



## Recyclebank



The City of BN is honored to have been chosen to represent Missouri in a National Recycling Challenge, sponsored by S. C. Johnson, Waste Management, Recycle Rewards and Recyclebank. Fifty (50) communities from the United States are competing and the city or neighborhood with the highest percent of homes participating will be awarded a \$100,000 grant for a "green project" that promotes sustainability.

By registering with Recyclebank, residents can earn points good for coupons, merchandise, magazines, entertainment and much more. The challenge starts July 2 and ends December 31, 2012, but residents can earn awards until June, 2014.

To join go to: **Recyclebank.com/greenchoices** and create your own account by entering your unique pin number mailed to you on June 26, 2012. Residents can link their account by their home address if they don't have their PIN. When you join, you will automatically earn 300 points to start you off. Explore the web site to learn how to earn more points and find how the points can be redeemed.

Anyone who does not have access to a computer, can join by calling 1-888-727-2978.

Residents can also stop by the Recreation Center and log in on one of our computers. The staff will be glad to get you started with Recyclebank and also link you to the City of BN web site.

The challenge will be judged based on each community's participation in recycling as reported on the program's website. The community with the highest percentage of their population reporting they have recycled each month will be crowned the winner.

Recycling carts are available for anyone who does not have one or needs a second cart. Call 867-0076 and order yours now. Recycling carts were made possible by a grant from St. Louis County and are free.

### What Can Be Recycled?

**Plastic** - Check the bottom of plastic bottles, containers and packaging for a small triangle with a number inside. Items with numbers 1 through 5 and 7 can be recycled. This includes:

- Clear and green plastic soda bottles
- Clear and colored plastic milk, juice bottles
- Detergent and fabric softener bottles & jugs
- Narrow neck bottles for health, beauty containers
- Household cleaner bottles
- Plastic margarine tubs, frozen dessert cups
- Rings from 6 and 12 packs
- Plastic yogurt and pudding cups
- Narrow neck syrup and catsup bottles
- Plastic buckets and containers under 5 gallon

Polystyrene, (#6) cannot be recycled at this time.

**Paper** - All kinds of paper can be recycled. Please remove wire binders, clips and plastic from paper. This includes:

- Newspaper, typing paper, envelopes
- Catalogs, telephone books, paperback books
- Junk mail, envelopes and computer paper
- Cereal, cake mix, food and gift boxes
- Soda and beer can carrying cases
- Cardboard and carrier stock
- Magazines and flyers

**Glass** - Glass bottles & jars (Clear, green and brown only.) No window glass, dinnerware or ceramics.

**Metals** - Rinsed aluminum cans, trays, foil, steel cans and tins.

Compact Fluorescent Light bulbs (CFLs) are safe to use and save energy, but contain mercury and should be recycled safely. Please take advantage of the following authorized CFL Recycling locations nearest to the City of BN. (There is no charge for recycling.)

### Neighborhood Watch - Neighborhood Ownership



Jennifer Meyers, Director of Crime Victim Advocacy Services (CVAC), was the guest speaker at the Neighborhood Watch Meeting on June 6, 2012. CVAC is the oldest, continually operating support center for crime victims in the St. Louis Area. Jennifer explained the Center can help

victims of crime by providing resources, counseling, advocacy and referral for victims of crime and their families, free of charge. More important, the CVAC provides emergency crisis intervention services and information about rights as a victim. In 2011, more than 108,000 serious crimes were reported in the St. Louis Region. Each one has a victim. **The CVAC gives victims a voice.** 

CVAC is available for victims of serious crimes like murder, rape, abuse, hate crimes, sexual assault, and domestic violence. Jennifer urges victims of serious crime to contact CVAC at 652-3623 to ask about resources that are available to help.

Patrol Officer Dane Kaltenbach was the "Officer of the Month" at the Neighborhood Watch Meeting. Patrolman Kaltenbach urged resi-



dents to call in any suspicious people, sounds or vehicles. He also urged residents to follow through on complaints so offenders are not dismissed in court and released to offend again. P. O. Kaltenbach answered questions from the group. Curfew for minors, under the age of 16, is 11 PM on Monday through Thursday and Midnight on Friday and Saturday (per Ordinance #16-16). Parents can be held responsible for children under 17 years old (per Ordinance #16-1), Parental Neglect. He urged residents to call in violations as soon as they realize something is wrong.

### **Preventing A/C Unit Theft**

The demand for copper, combined with the economic crisis, is creating an increase in copper-theft crimes. Theft of air conditioning (A/C) units has become increasingly popular because of the copper and aluminum content. State and local governments are working to monitor businesses that buy copper and aluminum, but theft is still occurring. In an effort to deter the theft of A/C units, several companies are marketing alarms and cages. This may deter the theft, but doesn't prevent it. Sometimes thieves move onto an easier A/C unit when they have to work harder to get to the unit.

A less expensive alternative is simply to lock the electrical disconnect box near the A/C unit. Then the thief cannot shut the power down to your unit and risks severe shock or electrocution.

A padlock is inexpensive and available almost anywhere. Simply place the lock through the holes in the box and cover. Be sure to keep the key or combination in a safe place so you can open the disconnect box for repairs or normal maintenance.

The best deterrent to crimes of any kind is neighbors watching out for each other. When neighbors call the Police Department when they hear suspicious

sounds, see suspicious people or vehicles, the criminals are caught and the problem is eliminated.

Report all suspicious activity to the Police Department at 911 or 889-2341 IMMEDIATELY.

### Safe, Convenient Disposal Of Drugs



In order to keep prescription and over-the-counter drugs from being abused, accidentally or intentionally misused by children in the home, and out of our water ways, Missouri Prescription Pill and Drug Disposal (P2D2), a not-for-profit organization, has joined with the St. Louis County Police, the St. Louis College of Pharmacy, Missouri American Water, and the Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District to make disposal of drugs safe, convenient and free.

P2D2 collection boxes were installed at 4 St. Louis County Police Stations, including the North County Precinct, 11815 Benham Road, just North of Redman Road. The station is open 24/7 and residents can deposit drugs anonymously. Missouri P2D2 collects and disposes of drugs responsibly.

P2D2 accepts prescription medications (including controlled substances), all over-the-counter medications, pet medications, vitamins and supplements, medicated ointments, lotions, creams, oils, liquid medication in leak-proof containers, homeopathic and herbal remedies, and suppositories. Remove labels, use a black marker to cross out any identifying information on your pill bottles or place the pills in a plastic bag before they go into the drop box.


#### **Heating & Cooling Centers**

#### War Of 1812 Exhibit At Bissell House

St. Louis County Parks announces a new exhibit, the War of 1812, at the General Daniel Bissell House Museum. The War of 1812, is often referred to as the second American Revolution. On June 18, 1812, the US declared war on the British Empire. Reasons included trade restrictions, impressment of sailors and humiliations on the high seas. This was the first time the United States had declared war.

You can view an exhibit on the oft forgotten conflict at the Bissell House Museum and get a tour of this magnificent old house. The exhibit includes descriptive panels from the Museum of the U.S. Navy, General Daniel Bissell artifacts, including the field desk that he used during the war, and prints from the Company of Military Historians.



The museum, at 10225 Bellefontaine Road, will be open from 10 AM to 3:30 PM every Friday or you can schedule a visit any other day by calling (314) 544-6224 or (314) 544-5714. Cost of the tour is \$5 per person. Children are free.

In the aftermath of the April 2011 tornado, several of the churches answered the call by feeding and taking care of the volunteers that rolled in to help cut the trees and get the debris out of yards. The churches' response was immediate, but we wondered what it would have been like if we had been organized and prepared before the tornado.

A meeting was called with the 11 churches and 4 Notfor-profit organizations in the city. The group adopted the name, Bellefontaine Community Pride (BCP) and meets on the 4th Thursday of each month at 3 PM. Pastors, church members and officers represent the membership of the individual organizations. Members of the Human Relations Commission joined in to help the individual groups unite. ### **Riverview Gardens High School Class of 2012**


Please do not rake leaves into the streets, sewers or creeks because they can cause a back-up in your basements. Leaves raked around trees can be an invitation to critters for their winter home.

The decision of the BOA is final.
