The Commission welcomed Shirley Paro as the new Aldermanic Representative. The Commission also welcomed Keith Goldstein as the new Chief of the Riverview Fire Department.

There was some discussion of renewed suspicious activity at Klein Park, and the non-response of residents to "shots fired" incidents. Corporal Hendon recommends residents report all "shots fired" incidents, even if there aren't many details.

Alderman Paro noted a change in state Law regarding dangerous dogs. Dogs can no longer be profiled by breed as inherently dangerous.

The Police Department was thanked for their basketball games at the Bellefontaine Youth Center.
