Barbara West spoke about curfew and would like the Board of Aldermen to review the ordinance. Discussion about shopping carts around the city and what to do if they become a nuisance. The store should be notified first. If this becomes an issue, then contact the police.

Recommendation to the Board of Aldermen: enforce the curfew ordinance. Police can refer children who violate the ordinance to juvenile authorities. Police will also take the children to their homes. Curfew rules should be placed in the next Newsletter.

Discussion about open burning. Check with your jurisdiction before any open burning. There is not allowed in Bellefontaine Neighbors. Education is the key to prevent any hazards from open burning. Is it possible to announce "red flag warnings" over the alert sirens?

Call the police non-emergency number if you have a complaint.
