Mark reported we have started cleaning the Parks already and they should be open the second week of April.

New lounges for the outdoor pool were mentioned. A discussion followed including the pool opening on the Saturday of Memorial Day Weekend as well as how the Hoops Day held on Saturday March 11th went. Mark mentioned it ran about 2 hours or so. One person arrived late and that age group had already finished. They gave them the option of participating with the older group. The person moved up a bracket and won. So age really doesn't always matter. The Youth Commission will probably tweak a few things and have it again next year.

Mark asked if anyone has anything else? Dave asked if Markita and the Community Action group have anything planned for the lot yet and Mark said we really won't know anything until after she meets with the Mayor and I think they are meeting tomorrow evening. A discussion followed.

Kathy Endorf mentioned they are expecting their first grandchild and she was congratulated by the other Park Board Members. She also said she won't be able to help with the Golf Tournament because she will be playing in it.

Jane Davis reported she won't be able to make the next meeting due to the "Cardinal's Game". A discussion followed.
