Fire Department: Chief Goldstein reminded everyone that fireworks are illegal in all of Saint Louis County. There are two authorized fireworks displays in our area; the Missouri Veteran's Home on June 24<sup>th</sup>, and Norwood Hills Country Club. The committee recommended the Board of Aldermen consider following Florissant's lead in posting yard signs announcing that fireworks are illegal.

The city is expecting to receive approximately half a million dollars from Prop P funds next year. People should start thinking now on how the money should be allocated.

The construction company will put up signs and flyers as work shifts to new areas. Please do not block street access in construction areas. The police will ticket and tow vehicles that block construction.
