Mark opened the Park Board Meeting at 7:01 p.m.

A discussion followed concerning the Discover Fishing Program that ended on August 3rd.

Judy Mantych reported there were 105 people in attendance for the Eclipse Party and they had a really good time. Martha mentioned there were people watching the Eclipse from the plaza and by the pool. A discussion followed including the Eclipse glasses as well as the Eclipse Coffee Mugs and Koozies that were given as attendance prizes. They also received Goodie Bags that contained Moon Pies, Sun Chips and Star Bursts. There were new participants who came back the next week for the BBQ Dinner. A discussion followed.

Mark reported The Beer and Wine Event is scheduled for Saturday, October 14th if anyone would be available to help. A discussion followed and Kathy Endorf said she won't be able to make it that night. A discussion followed including the sale of tickets. Mark mentioned the \$5.00 ticket includes cheese, sausage and crackers.

Mark reported the indoor pool has been repainted and looks very nice. A discussion followed.

The water leak on the side of the building has been fixed but we still have to do the concrete work.

Mark reported the BBQ Dinner on August 29 went well and there were around 55 people in attendance. Martha mentioned we use to serve them outside but we've moved in because the participants prefer it.

A discussion followed concerning trimming some of the trees on the Recreation Center Grounds.

Mark reported the Halloween Dinner is scheduled for Tuesday, October 17th and the Halloween Party is scheduled for Friday, October 20th and the Youth Commission will be helping with that.

Martha Snead mentioned presenting new ideas in order to get more participation in the pool. We have people for classes and swim team but we don't get people for open swim. It's not only a waste of our facility it's a shame the residents aren't using it but it's not good for our employees. If we have a good crowd in the pool the lifeguards are on point and doing what they're supposed to do. I have to have nearly the same number of guards whether I have a good crowd or not. I want it to be better used. One of our employees is involved with Girl Scouts and she is going to get further involved with the Mariners. They have a group looking for a place to practice. Mark mentioned we had a scout group that practiced every Saturday for years. They had 150 kids or more that practiced. Dave mentioned Troop 229 & 374 scouts came up once a month. Martha said we used to have day camps that would bring in groups. A discussion followed concerning the loss of most of the day camps that used our pools in the past. I will be opening it up to Swim Team participants and I don't think it's a problem. Out of 65 families only 7 swim team families purchased the pass. A discussion followed concerning the rising cost for lifeguards. We need a way to get the residents interested in swimming. Martha plans to present more ideas in the coming months and welcomes suggestions from Park Board Members.
