Facility Admission Policies and Rules

- 1. All patrons must abide by the department's ID, Pass, Fee, and Guest Policies
- 2. Inappropriate language or conduct perceived as threatening, inappropriate or less than family-friendly will not be tolerated and will result in removal from the facility.
- 3. Children 9 years of age and under must be with an adult age16 or older at all times. An adult must remain in the building with the children during family time.
- 4. Guests must stay with the resident at all times. The resident is responsible for the guest's behavior. Misconduct of either party will result in the removal of both.
- 5. Proper attire is required in every area of the recreation facility at all times. This includes the wearing of shirts in the gymnasium, hallways and weight room as well as pants that cover any and all under clothing.
- 6. Weight room users must complete a release form. All users must bring a sweat towel and abide by the rules attached to the form.
- 7. Each resident is allowed **one** guests in the pool during open or lap swim. Non-resident swim guests must pay appropriate fee for admission.
- 8. All patrons on the pool deck whether you are swimming or not must pay the admission fee.
- 9. Properly lined swim attire is required. No gym shorts, leotards, sport bras or street clothes are allowed in the pool.
- 10. All diapers must be changed using the diaper changing stations located in the locker rooms.

Recreation Department resident ID cards are required by all residents four years of age or older to enter the facility, use the gymnasium, pool, sauna, racquetball court, to reserve rooms or parks or receive resident rates for classes. With a resident general ID card you pay daily user fees each time you swim, workout or play basketball, unless you have purchased a membership Pass. All passes also require a general ID card.

All ID cards and passes will be valid 1 year from date of purchase

To get a resident ID card you must:

- 1. Be on a current Bellefontaine Neighbors occupancy permit.
- 2. Bring a picture ID showing your Bellefontaine Neighbors address (driver's license, school or work ID).
- 3. Bring your occupancy permit, utility bill, or bank statement if your picture ID does not have your Bellefontaine Neighbors address.
- 4. Bring a parent with a picture ID if a child does not have the required identification.

^{*}Every membership must purchase a Resident/Non-Resident ID card for individuals 4 years of age and older.

^{*}Renew Active/Silver Sneaker members must be enrolled in the program through their health insurance.

^{*}Non-Resident ID Card is only valid with a purchase of a membership. Not for daily admission fees.

^{*}Outdoor pool membership only allows access to the outdoor pool from Memorial Day to Labor Day.

^{*}Residents and Members are allowed to have one paying guest per day

Pool Closing and Inclement Weather Policy:

All facilities are subject to early closings for low attendance, weather concerns, or for a special program. The Outdoor Pool will close whenever projected high air temperatures for the day are below 70 degrees.

Lighting and high winds pose a serious risk of injury at aquatic facilities. When inclement weather occurs, the staff will clear the water and the pool deck. The staff will remain at the facility and attempt to reopen as soon as possible. If it is not feasible to reopen after forty-five minutes, the pool will close. We will give Rain Checks to those patrons in attendance.

ROOM INFORMATION

Room Reservations

There are two meeting rooms at the Recreation Center available for any **adult resident with a current ID card** to rent for birthdays, anniversaries, bridal and baby showers or other functions. Weddings receptions and family reunions are not

permitted.

- The smaller room (109) will accommodate 35 and the fee is \$165
- The larger room (101) will accommodate 47 and the fee is
 \$175



- This deposit will be refunded if the room is cleaned up after your function, your group follows the facility rules and you do not exceed the limit of the room. Please note that all guests must stay in the room. The game room, gymnasium or pools are not available without the proper resident to guest ratio and fees paid. After you have cleaned the room, inform the recreation staff. You both will inspect the room and sign the check list. If everything is in order, you will receive your security deposit by mail within one month. The resident:
- May only reserve one room per date for an event.
- Any resident household may rent a room once a month maximum.
- Must be present for the entire function.
- Is responsible for the behavior of their guests.

Important Room Guide Lines

- You can not enter the room until 11:00 a.m. the day of the reservation. The room must be cleaned up and all guests must be out of the building before 5:30 p.m.
- Due to the size of our meeting rooms and our hours of operation, the rooms may not be reserved for wedding receptions or family reunions.
- Sales, collection of fees or admissions or fundraising of any kind is prohibited in our meeting rooms.
- No refunds will be issued for cancellations made less than two weeks prior to the reservation date.
- There is a \$3.00 service charge on reservation cancellations.
- GLITTER OR CONFETTI ARE NOT PERMITTED IN THE BUILDING. YOU WILL LOSE YOUR DEPOSIT.
- No painting or crafts that may damage the condition of the carpeting is allowed.

Park Reservations

The City of Bellefontaine Neighbors has three picnic shelters with restrooms and electricity available for reservations located at:

- Bissell Hills Park, 10237 Ashbrook, capacity: 75
- St. Cyr Park, 1037 Hopedale, capacity 125
- Tanglewood Park, 1180 Chambers, capacity 125
- Bellefontaine Neighbors residents with a current Bellefontaine ID card may reserve any of the three shelters for \$60.00. Nonresidents may reserve Tanglewood Park only for \$100.00
- No refunds will be issued for cancellations made less than two weeks prior to the reservation date. A \$3.00 cancellation fee applies.

Park Rules

- The parks open at 9:00 a.m. and close at dusk.
- Organized groups of 10 or more must obtain a park permit through the Recreation Department.
- No glass bottles are allowed...
- Alcohol is allowed by permit only.
- · Loud music is prohibited.
- All pet waste must be disposed of properly.
- No personal barbeque pits or play equipment (I.E. bounce houses, pools, etc.) are allowed in the parks.
- Any commercial entertainment business must provide the City with a certificate of insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 per incident naming the City as an additional insurer.

Greetings Neighbors,

As my term as Mayor ends, it is time to reflect upon what has transpired in our City over the last 4-years during my administration. When I was elected Mayor in 2019, my first major challenge was to promptly address the rising waters of the mighty Mississippi River and Maline Creek that posed a flood threat to our residents in Ward 4. Through the amazing efforts of our citizens, employees, utility companies, and emergency management teams, we were able to minimize flood damage to homes after building an enormous sandbag wall to hold the water back.

My second major challenge was managing our City through the COVID-19 pandemic and minimize the impact of this virus on our community and the City's employees. Further, the pandemic created financial and other hardships for many of us, however, the City remained financially healthy and continued to provide the best service possible to our citizens through a modified way of conducting business. \$746,853.00 of CARES Act Municipal Relief Fund monies were obtained to supplement revenue lost during this period. Lastly, the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) provided the City with over \$2M in funds.

My third major challenge was operating a City during a lengthy period of time when the Board of Aldermen did not meet because of the lack of a quorum. This had a significant impact on the day-to-day City business, however, bills continued to get paid, decisions that kept moving the City forward were made, and service to residents was not interrupted. The elections of April 2022 proved productive with the introduction of new residents to the Board, meetings resumed and business continues in its normal fashion.

Even though my term was challenging, it was also rewarding. As I look back upon my work for the City, I have been blessed to have had the privilege to serve you as Mayor. I am humbled by my accomplishments and I am honored to have met so many new people and worked side-by-side with the best residents and municipal employees. For all of this, I am thankful. Shaw will proceed as the representative for the Missouri State Teacher of the Year nomination.

Riverview Gardens School District will implement the Yondr Pouch phone locking system at Riverview Gardens High School, Central Middle School and Westview Middle School for the 2023-2024 school year. RGHS has delayed the implementation of the Yondr Pouch system in order to allow time for the implementation of the new policies to be in place.

Once implemented, middle and high school scholars will be required to lock their phones in a secure pouch during the school day. The students will keep the pouches in their possession. Teachers and/or administrators will have the ability to unlock the pouches during emergencies and when needed for academic purposes and when exiting campus. The High School will pilot the system during MAP and EOC testing.

The Yondr Organization surveyed over 900 school partners to measure the effects of creating phone-free educational environments. These schools achieved notable progress in multiple areas:

65% of schools saw an improvement in academic performance

74% of schools saw an improvement in student behavior

83% of schools saw an improvement in student engagement in the classroom

Bellefontaine Neighbors Ordinances (Laws)

- Effective June 1, 2023 Registration of Residential Rental Real Estate and Property Maintenances Changes, please check the city website.
- SPEED LIMIT is 20 mph on residential streets.
- Noise is prohibited within 100 feet.
- Every household is required to have trash service through Waste Management.
- Trash containers should be placed at the curb no earlier than 5pm on the day prior to your trash day and removed by 5pm on the day after collection.
- Yard Waste is not to be placed/or blown into the street. This includes Grass Clipping, Leaves, and other vard Debris.
- Do not Blow Your Horn!
- All Dumpsters MUST have a permit from the city.
